1. Matrika (dr. Špaček)

- Všem členům byla připsána výše členského příspěvku za rok 2024, tj. 300,- Kč (řádní členové), resp. 100,- Kč (senioři a studenti).
- Poté byl vypracován přehled úhrady členských příspěvků:
 - → matrika eviduje nezaplacené členské příspěvky za dva roky (2023 a starší) u 8 řádných členů (celkový nedoplatek 600,- Kč), a 1 seniorského člena (nedoplatek 200,- Kč).
 - → matrika neeviduje žádného řádného člena s nedoplatkem vyšším než 600,- Kč,- (tj. za více než 2 roky).
 - → matrika eviduje dva členy seniory s dluhem vyšším než 200,- (tj. za více než 2 roky). Těmto členům hrozí dle čl. VI ods. 2a Stanov vyloučení.
- Platební aktivita v běžícím roce je velmi dobrá, z celkového počtu 204 členů (z toho 6 čestných, tj. 198 platících) v prvním čtvrtletí své příspěvky za rok 2024 uhradilo již 143 členů.

2. Hospodaření (dr. Šorf)

- a) Prof. Vrba upozornil na zajímavou věc související s úsporným balíčkem vlády: nově se nebude platit daň z rybníků k intezivnímu a průmyslovému chovu ryb. Dr. Duras v mailové diskusi upozornil, že: "rybníky s "intenzivním" chovem byly sice v minulosti zpoplatněny, ale Metodickým pokynem byly hranice mezi "polointenzivním" a "intenzivním" chovem ryb vymezeny tak, že žádný rybník do kategorie "intenzivního" chovu spadnout ani nemohl. Vše tedy bylo "polointenzivní" a od daně osvobozené. Z našeho pohledu je však polointenzivní chov vymezený dle Metodického pokynu již chovem "intenzivním".

AC noted that the merging of WG 1 and 2 has already been agreed and that it is now proposed to also incorporate WG4 which together will be known as the Scientific Committee – approved by the EFFS General Board.

3. Report on SEFS13

SJ noted the following in his report:

The SEFS13 book of abstracts will be circulated in January 2024.

The hosting of SEFS13, an honour for the FBA, was a success with 420 delegates from 27 countries. Efforts to minimize the environmental impacts (e.g. vegan meals) were well received. Feedback from delegates was complimentary of the social events and excursions and overall felt the meeting was 'inclusive' and particularly welcoming to early career researchers.

€2600 was raised to fund attendance of early career researchers at SEFS14.

TC expressed thanks on behalf of EFFS to SJ and the FBA team for organising a high standard conference.

4. SEFS14

OK gave on update on the organisation of SEFS14. He has spoken with Bolu university partners and members of the Limnological Society of Turkey who will help with the conference. A committee will come together in January to initiate the planning and identify tasks. The help of EFFS will be sought, starting with a meeting with members of Executive Committee (AC, SJ, MKQ, MSP) in January 2024. Among the priorities is a website to announce the conference.

AC emphasised that the organising committee should comprise representation of the Limnological Society of Turkey, other universities in Turkey and early career researchers.

Presentation and selection of next SEGS bids - SEFS15

AC noted that it is a goal of EFFS to support the hosting of SEFS in as many countries as possible including countries that have no national EFFS affiliated society (in particular those with SIL representation). The Netherlands will present a formal proposal (led by, Suzanne McGowan, Netherlands Institute of Ecology) to host SEFS15 in the coming months.

6. Report on EFFS FreshProjects

AC highlighted the importance of these projects in enabling and strengthening early career researcher networks. The 1st (EuroRun – 2016-2018) and 2nd (Urban Algae 2018-2020) freshProjects were successfully completed. The 3rd (EUROPONDS – 2020-2022) completed the final report and a paper is well advanced.

VdS reported that the PHYTOPLASTICS project has collected most of its data and data analysis is progressing well. AC informed the meeting that the report is not due until December 2024 and that the team can use the time and any unspent budget to prepare the report and papers.
